We have also embarked upon a fund raiser with the TEC heritage committee. We are selling bricks that will be placed around the minuteman statue that our association bought and had placed by the flag pole behind the TEC Headquarters building at McGhee Tyson Air base in Knoxville Tennessee. Currently we are selling the bricks for \$50 each and the brick order form is located on our website, the Facebook page, and in this issue of the Graduate. After July 21<sup>st</sup> the price of the bricks is going to go up to \$100 so take this opportunity to order yours soon.

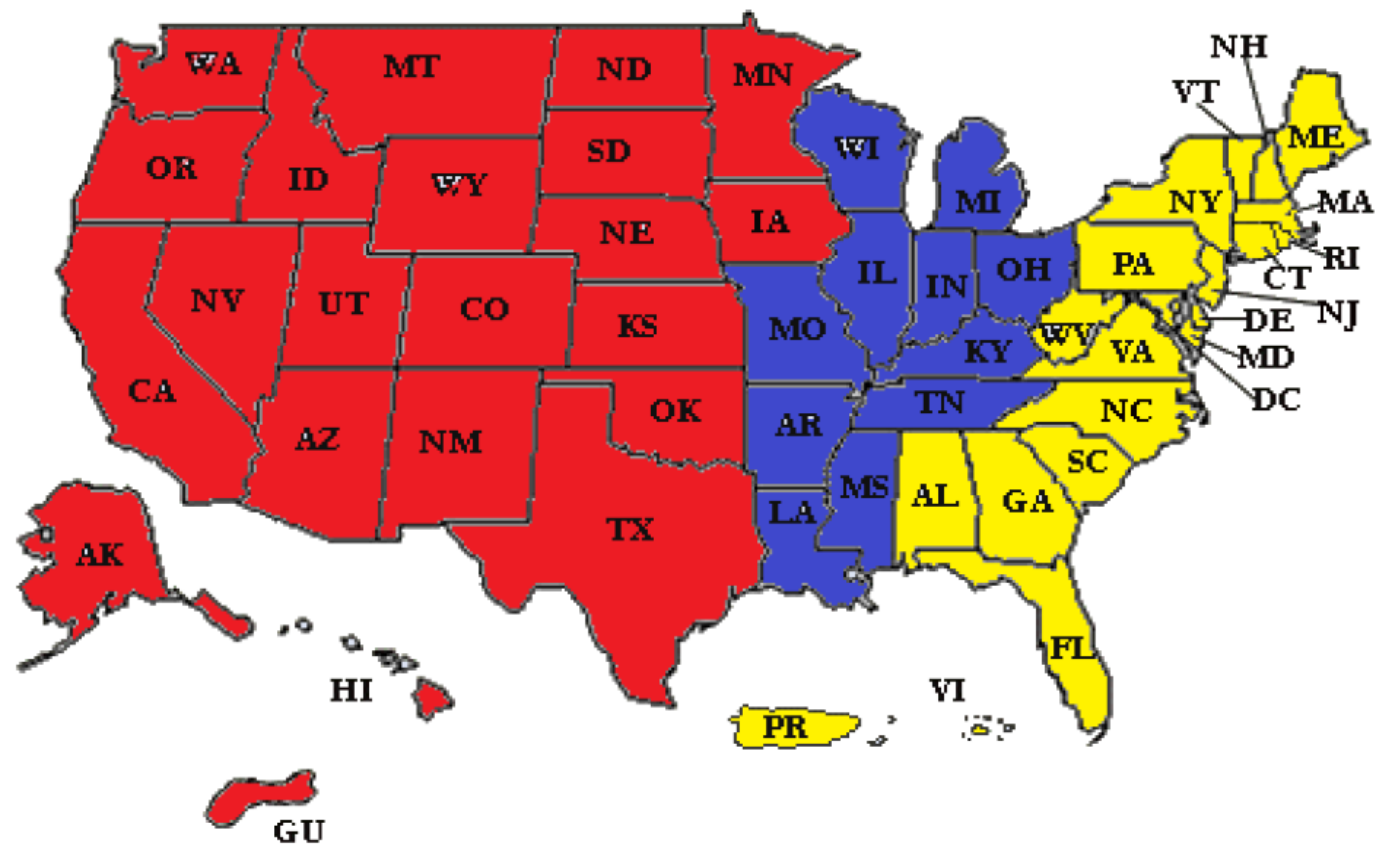
