sure you get your tickets from one of your board members or from me. The quilt raffle is the major fund raiser for our scholarship program.

We have also embarked upon a fund raiser with the TEC heritage committee. We are selling bricks that will be placed around the minuteman statue that our association bought and had placed by the flag pole behind the TEC Headquarters building at McGhee Tyson Air base in Knoxville Tennessee. 




